F BEATON Beaton, M. C. Death of a nurse / Grand Central Publishing, 2016

"M. C. Beaton's New York Times bestselling Hamish Macbeth series continues with a new mystery featuring Scotland's most quick-witted but unambitious policeman. James Harrison has recently moved to a restored hunting lodge in Sutherland with his gorgeous private nurse Gloria Dainty. When Hamish visits Mr. Harrison to welcome him to the neighborhood, the old man treats him very rudely. Gloria apologizes for her employer's behavior, and Hamish takes the plunge and invites her out for dinner. On the appointed evening, Hamish waits for Gloria at the restaurant. And waits. Gloria never shows up. Four days later, Gloria's body washes up on the beach near Braikie. Now without a date and without his former policeman Dick Fraser (who left the force to buy a bakery), Hamish must find out who killed the beautiful new resident of Sutherland, and why, before the murderer strikes again. F BOLANO Bolaño, Roberto. Last evenings on Earth / New Directions Books, 2007

"The melancholy folklore of exile," as Roberto Bolaño once put it, pervades these fourteen haunting stories. Bolaño's narrators are usually writers grappling with private (and generally unlucky) quests, who typically speak in the first person, as if giving a deposition, like witnesses to a crime. These protagonists tend to take detours and to narrate unresolved efforts. They are characters living in the margins, often coming to pieces, and sometimes, as in a nightmare, in constant flight from something horrid.

In the short story "Silva the Eye," Bolaño writes in the opening sentence: "It's strange how things happen, Mauricio Silva, known as The Eye, always tried to escape violence, even at the risk of being considered a coward, but the violence, the real violence, can't be escaped, at least not by us, born in Latin America in the 1950s, those of us who were around 20 years old when Salvador Allende died."

Set in the Chilean exile diaspora of Latin America and Europe, and peopled by Bolaño's beloved "failed generation," the stories of Last Evenings on Earth have appeared in The New Yorker and Grand Street."

F BRENNAN Brennan, Marie. A natural history of dragons: a memoir by Lady Trent / Tor, 2013

Isabella, Lady Trent, known as the world's preeminent dragon naturalist, writes her memoir detailing how she sought true love and happiness despite her lamentable eccentricities; and of her thrilling expedition to the perilous mountains of Vystrana, where she made the first of many historic dragon discoveries that would change the world forever.

F CASH Cash, Wiley. A land more kind than home: William Morrow, 2012

Growing up in a small North Carolina town, Jess Halle is plunged into an adulthood for which he is not prepared when his autistic older brother, Stump, sneaks a look at something he is not supposed to see, which has catastrophic repercussions.

F COEL Coel, Margaret. Night of the white buffalo / Berkley Prime Crime, 2015

"A mysterious penitent confesses to murder, and then flees the confessional before Father John can identify him. Two months later, Vicky discovers rancher Dennis Carey shot dead in his truck along Blue Sky Highway. With the tragic news comes the exposure of an astonishing secret: the most sacred creature in Native American mythology, a white buffalo calf, was recently born on Carey's ranch. The miraculous animal draws a flood of pilgrims to the reservation, frustrating Vicky and Father John's already difficult investigation as they try to unravel the strange events surrounding both Carey's murder and the recent disappearances of three cowboys. It could be coincidence, given a cowboy's nomadic life, but Vicky doesn't believe in coincidences. And at the back of Father John's mind is the voice from the man in the confessional: I killed a man. A team of four top scientists assembled by the Navy is sent to investigate a spaceship that has been on the ocean floor for at least 300 years and they discover a dangerous secret.

F HARVEY Harvey, Michael T. The Fifth Floor / Knopf, 2008

Private investigator Michael Kelly is hired by an ex-girlfriend to follow her abusive husband, and as he is led to an old house on Chicago's Northside, Kelly thinks he might have discovered the answer to who started the Great Chicago Fire of 1871.

F HIGGINS Higgins, Jack. Night of the fox / Pocket Books, 1987

In his biggest and most exciting novel since *The Eagle Has Landed*, Jack Higgins sweeps the reader into one of the most extraordinary--and secret--episodes of World War II: a mission to rescue from the hands of the Germans a man who knows the time and place of D-Day!

F OATES Oates, Joyce Carol. We were the Mulvaney / Plume, 1996

"Moving away from the dark tone of her more recent masterpieces, Joyce Carol Oates turns the tale of a family struggling to cope with its fall from grace into a deeply moving and unforgettable account of the vigor of hope and the power of love to prevail over suffering. The Mulvaney of High Point Farm in Mt. Ephraim, New York, are a large and fortunate clan, blessed with good looks, abundant charisma, and boundless promise. But over the twenty-five year span of this ambitious novel, the Mulvaney will slide, almost imperceptibly at first, from the pinnacle of happiness, transformed by the vagaries of fate into a scattered collection of lost and lonely souls. F RICHMAN Richman, Alyson. The lost wife / Berkley Books, 2011

F ROBB Robb, J. D. Brotherhood in death / Berkley Books, 2016

F SCALZI Scalzi, John. Lock in / Tor, 2014

"Fifteen years from now, a new virus sweeps the globe. 95% of those afflicted experience nothing worse than fever and headaches. Four percent suffer acute meningitis, creating the largest medical crisis in history. And one percent find themselves "locked in"--fully awake and aware, but unable to move or respond to stimulus. Albrecht, a leading expert on the subject of library safety, draws from a sound academic basis, direct experience in personal safety, and the wide array of workshops he has conducted. The book is comprehensive and practical, with the central focus on providing better customer service in a comfortable, confident, and safe manner. Albrecht does not minimize staff uneasiness in dealing with unruly, threatening, or potentially violent patrons, but he stresses the need for clear, consistent, and publicly posted policies before situations arise. Blueberry pickers near Harlem stumble upon neatly severed limbs in an overgrown ditch.
